## **Background**

The Friedrich-Ebert-Stiftung (office Shanghai) initiated the Asian-European-Labour Forum (AELF) to bring together labour research institutes, labour training institutes and think tanks closely linked to trade unions to exchange views on common interest in labour policy issues. The Forum is an annual event which is hosted by participating institutions in a rotational arrangements. The 1<sup>st</sup> AEFL was organized by the Hans-Böckler-Stiftung (HBS) in Düsseldorf (Germany) in 2009, while the 2<sup>nd</sup> AEFL was hosted by the Institute of Workers and Trade Unions (IWTU) of the Vietnam General Congress of Labour (VGCL) in Ha Long in 2010. The 3<sup>rd</sup> AEFL will have Fafo (Norway) as host.

The Friedrich-Ebert-Stiftung acts as a co-secretariat to all events and has agreed to provide some basic funding.

The 2<sup>nd</sup> AEFL has agreed that the agenda for the 2011 Forum will consist of two sections:

- ➤ 1-day discussion on wage policies with special focus on wage-led recovery for rebalancing the world economy;
- ➤ 1 or 1,5 day discussion on draft country reports for a book on: "Minimum Wages, Collective Bargaining and Economic Development in Asia and Europe A Comparative Labour Perspective"
